## 30 huts, 3 cable cars, 1 alpine pasture: enjoy all this with the Almencard

Only in the family-friendly alpine region Gitschberg Jochtal you will be given your personal Almencard upon arrival. It enables you to enjoy the area from the very first day of your stay by travelling on all cable cars free of charge and by joining guided cultural walks and hiking tours. Climbing courses for children, knights' games and visits to farms are also held weekly by the local tourist board.

You will receive your free Almencard from your host and it is valid for your whole stay between 31 may and 18th October 2009.

Please present your Almencard at the cable car stations, when booking a guided tour or when purchasing at our partners.

### The Almencard includes 16 services:

1. Gitschberg cable car
2. Jochtal cable car
3. Rio di Pusteria/Mühlbach-Maranza/Meransen cable car
4. Panoramic walk at Maranza/Meransen
5. Farm to farm tour in the valley Val di Fundres/Pfunders
6. Bee stories – everything about honey & bees
7. Cultural visit at the Mühlbacher Klause ruin
8. Historical cultural tour at Spinga/Spinges „Discovering Katharina Lanz“
9. Sun-rise hike in Valles/Vals (from mid June)
10. Hike through the golden autumn (mid September – mid October)
11. Krixly Kraxly climbing course for children from 5 to 9 years in Valles/Vals
12. „Kletterhetz“ climbing course for children from 10 to 14 years
13. Milk stories for children – everything about farms in Rodengo/Rodeneck
14. Knight games for children at the Mühlbacher Klause ruin
15. Excursion on horse-drawn sleigh for children in Maranza/Meransen
16. Discounts in shops, leisure facilities and museums

The guided tours and events take place every week.
